Goals & Objectives

- HUD outlined the following goals and objectives of the FY 2025 CoC NOFO
 - Ending the Crisis of Homelessness on Our Streets
 - Prioritizing Treatment and Recovery
 - Advancing Public Safety
 - Promoting Self-Sufficiency
 - Improving Outcomes
 - Minimizing Trauma

Major FY2025 NOFO Changes

- Tier 1 reduced to 30% of ARD
- Tier 2 70% of ARD and funding is competitive
- Permanent Housing is capped at 30% of ARD
- Major shift to TH, Supportive Services, & Street Outreach
- Emphasis on:
 - Treatment & recovery
 - Service requirements for participants
 - Public safety and Coordination with Law Enforcement

Eligible Program Components

- Joint TH-RRH no longer an eligible program component for New Projects
- Eligible program components for new projects:
 - PH (RRH, PSH)
 - TH
 - SS0
 - Street Outreach
- Although PSH and RRH are eligible project components, the CoC will need to adhere to the 30% cap of ARD for PH.

Consolidated Application

- Tier 2 Projects will compete nationally against all projects and will undergo Merit Review
- Three Scoring Areas:
- New Certification & Compliance Requirements
 - Coordination & Engagement
 - System Performance
 - Project Capacity
- Public safety, treatment access, employment outcomes
- Higher scrutiny for Risk Review

HUD Merit Review Scoring Overview

- Project Capacity, Review & Ranking (9 Points)
- System Performance (40 Points)
- Coordination & Engagement (81 Points)
- Bonus: Merger + Policy Initiatives (23 Points)
 - CoC Merger (15 Points)
 - Opportunity Zones (4 points)
 - Verification of Immigration Status (4 points)

Risk Review

- All projects are eligible to under a Risk Review
- Prior to approving an award HUD will be able to evaluate each project's likelihood of success based on some of the following criteria:
 - Financial Stability
 - Quality of management systems
 - History of performance
 - Capacity of the application (staffing structures and capabilities)
 - Promotion of self-sufficiency and
 - Ability to produce positive outcomes.

What Are We Eligible to Apply for?

Estimated ARD	Tier 1	CoC Bonus	DV Bonus	CoC Planning Grant
\$887,901	\$266,370	\$256,075	\$128,037	\$64,019

- Total amount of award dedicated to PH (PSH, RRH, TH-RRH)= \$769,899
- That is a difference of \$503,529 between what we are eligible to apply for in PH projects and RNCoCs current Annual Renewal Amount for PH programs.

Renewal Projects – What are the Options

- Reallocation
 - Projects can choose to Reallocate all or a portion of their Annual Renewal Amount
- Transition Grant
 - Projects can apply for a Transition Grant
 - This will allow a project 1 year to transition a renewable project to a project of a different program component.
 - For example: a PH project can transition from that program component to TH or Street Outreach to better support the community and align with new funding priorities.
- Apply for a New Project

RNCoC Local Competition Overview

- New Projects
 - Narrative
 - Attachments
- Renewal Applications will consist of a 2-parts scoring process
 - Performance Metrics
 - Narrative Component
 - Attachments should support narratives
- Expansion Projects and Transition Grants will be asked to complete only a New Project Application

New Project Scoring

- Total 100 points Narrative
 - Project Design and Alignment (15 points)
 - Required or Structured Supportive Services (10 points)
 - Treatment & Recovery partnerships (10 points)
 - Collaboration (10 points)
 - Projected Outcomes & Performance (20 points)
 - Targeting, Timeliness & Cost-effectiveness (10 points)
 - HMIS/Data Quality Plan (10 points)
 - Organizational Capacity & Start-up Readiness (10 points)
 - Budget Summary & Staffing Plan (5 points)
 - Bonus (OZ/SAVE/Lived Experience/ Leveraging Healthcare Resources) (up to 10 points)
 - Reallocation or Transition Grant applicants Bonus (10 points)

Renewal Project Performance Scoring

- For FY25, HUD expects 50% of total score to be based on Objective criteria
- Additionally, 25% of the total score specifically should relate to:
 - Returns to homelessness performance measures
 - Employment and Income Performance measures
 - Supportive Service Participation Requirements
- Objective Performance Metrics (65% of total score) (65 points)
 - Returns to homelessness (24 months) (15 points)
 - Length of Time Homeless (LOT) (10 points)
 - Exits to Permanent Housing/Housing Stability (10 points)
 - Employment Income Increase (10 points)
 - Data Quality & Timeliness (10 points)
 - Utilization & Turnover (5 points)
 - Cost Per Successful Outcome (5 points)

Renewal Project Narrative

- Narrative Component Alignment with local & National Priority (35 points)
 - Required or Structured Service Participation (7 points)
 - Treatment & Recovery Integration (7 points)
 - Law Enforcement/Public Safety Collaboration (7 points)
 - Strategies to Reduce Length of Time homeless and Returns to Homelessness (6 points)
 - Employment & Income Growth (5 points)
 - Mitigating Barriers (3 points)
 - Bonus Points:
 - Reallocation (10 points)
 - Opportunity Zone, Immigration verification, Lived Experience (up to 10 points)

What You Will Need

- All applicants will be required to:
 - Complete a Letter of Intent- due 12/5
 - Complete a Compliance/Risk Review for each project application
 - Winged Wolf will review all completed Compliance/Risk Review to:
 - Conduct Threshold Review on applications
 - And assess level of Risk for any project application for awareness of what could be riskier projects in Tier 2
 - Complete the appropriate Project Application in Survey Monkey due 12/15
 - Links will post to the RNCoC Local Competition Page
 - Provide attachments to the Application in Survey Monkey due 12/15
 - List of attachments will post to the RNCoC Local Competition page
- The team is in the process of drafting guidance documents to assist applicants.

Local Timeline

- Nov 13: Release of HUD CoC NOFO
- Nov 24: Strategic Informational Session and Release of Timeline
- Dec 15: Local project app deadline by 5:00 PM
- Dec 17 –19: Rating and Ranking Team Review
- Dec 22: Deliberation Day
- Dec 29: Applications Due in eSnaps
- Dec 30: Public posting of CoC Consolidated Application, Priority Listing, and Attachments
- Jan 14: HUD deadline (8PM EST)
